### Sizewell B - Careers trip

Year 9 and 10 students enjoyed a visit to Sizewell B this month, a nuclear power station located on the Suffolk coast. It is the UK's only Pressurised Water Reactor.

Students were kitted out in safety clothing and were able to tour the site, meet different personnel and find out more about nuclear energy which links to their science curriculum and also find out more about employment in the energy sector - everything from support staff, contractors, admin personnel and scientists.

An enjoyable and informative trip with some excellent singing from students on the coach journey!

The lifetime output of Sizewell B is 243TWh, enough to power every home in Suffolk for 178 years.

Avoiding 85m tonnes of CO2 emissions, this is like taking 41m cars off UK roads for a year!


