




#### Storm Elite Cheerleading - Violet, Year 8




#### **Brightlingsea Music Festival Poster**

They all entered the 80/85 cm class as a team and won!


Cassie was also 1st individually and Lilly 3rd. Lilly won her 75cm class and Cassie won her 90/95cm class.
