Our students were very excited to receive their books, asking each lesson when they would arrive!


Before half term, students were given these out and they could not wait to dive in. Happy reading!



STEM Club - Miss Elliott



These hands-on projects not only make STEM subjects come alive but also highlight the power of creative exploration in education.






European Day of Languages - Ms Hillier

comes to speaking without a planned speech, it is more difficult, but Jack Petchey helped me with my improvisation skills."


Charlotte said "It was nice to meet new people and talk to other people that you wouldn't normally in the Jack Petchey workshop. I am alright with improvisation and it helped me build these skills. As an actor, I am used to using scripts but this was a different type of speaking that I enjoyed. It made me interested in wanting to see the other speakers in the competition later in the year."

Freya said "You learned about the people in your group and you got an opportunity to tell others about something that you care about. It was interesting to hear other people's passions and that everyone has their own things they want to talk about that I hadn't

considered before as much."

Lucy said "I think the team building exercises at the start helped build my confidence as it made it easier for me to talk to the strangers in the room and that we had a closer bond by the end of the day. It felt like everyone was willing to listen, whereas in other situations some students might not be so inclined to listen to what you are saying."

Albert said "I think the people in the room realised that everyone else was just as nervous to talk and was willing to listen. It made me realise that everyone has their own issues that other people don't know about that they hide away. It helped with my confidence in speaking out publicly."
